





Counselling delivery increased by

260 sessions

to a total of 2,672 sessions delivered to 334 clients

(159 face-to-face and 175 remotely)



We have run 109 Neuro Gym activity sessions

including boccia, Tai Chi, yoga, table tennis and indoor kurling





The Neuro Gym has inducted 97 clients who have completed 671 workouts




There is a lot more awareness out there as well, that there are skills that come with being more neurodivergent that are actually very useful to have.




This year, The Brain Food Café sold 4,662 hot beverages and 3,279 hot meals, resulting in £26,847 in sales
